

Quick Takeaways:

❑ *Brexit Concerns:*

- ❑ Sentiment toward Brexit among respondents in the UK leans decidedly negative.
- ❑ Most respondents think the UK will probably not or definitely not exit by the October 31st deadline (68.4%). Only 5.7% said they think the UK will definitely exit by October 31st.
- ❑ A good chunk of respondents believe the UK economy will worsen after the UK leaves the EU and that it will negatively impact their personal finances/ability to spend. With expectations leaning toward thinking the UK will not leave by the deadline in October, consumer sentiment in the UK could take a hit if they actually do leave by the deadline.

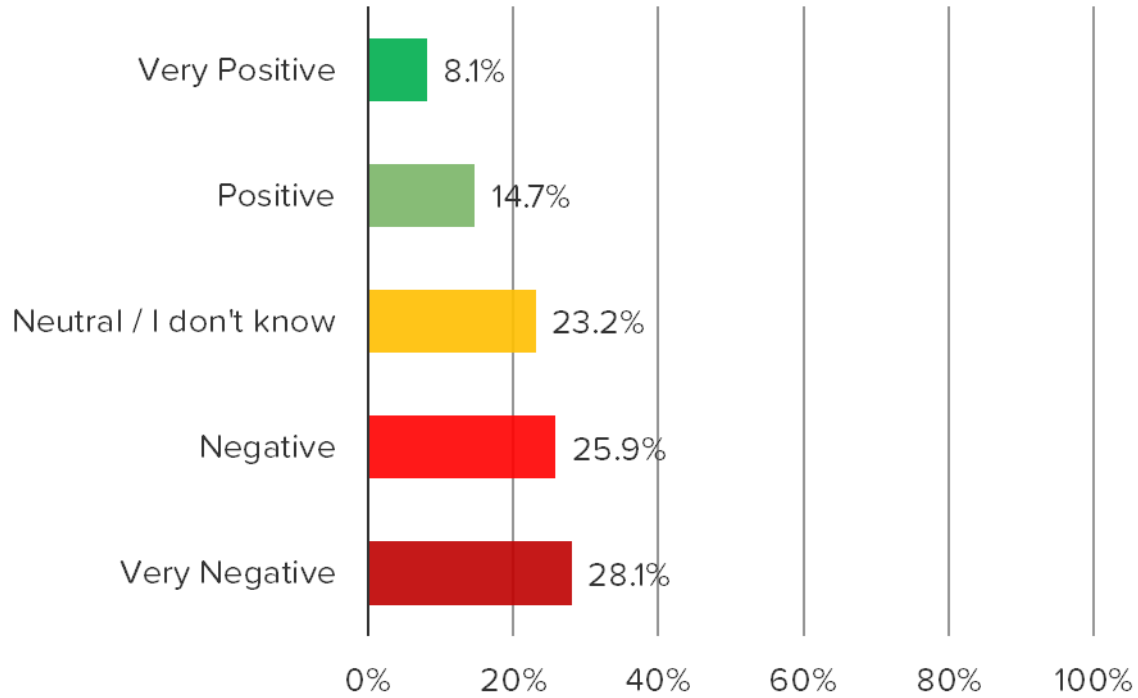
❑ *Sentiment Toward Finances Continue To Decline:*

- ❑ Overall, consumer sentiment toward the wellbeing of their personal finances has progressively worsened over the past three years.
- ❑ Along with declines in sentiment toward finances, feelings toward ability to spend money has also pulled back.



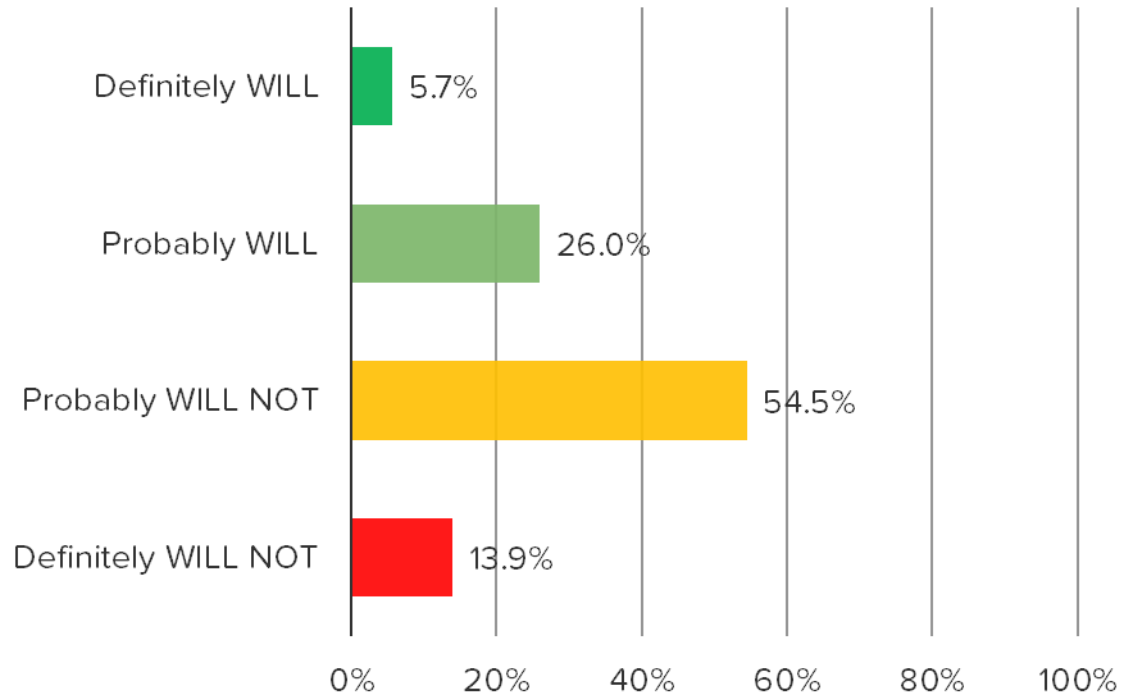
What is your opinion of Brexit?

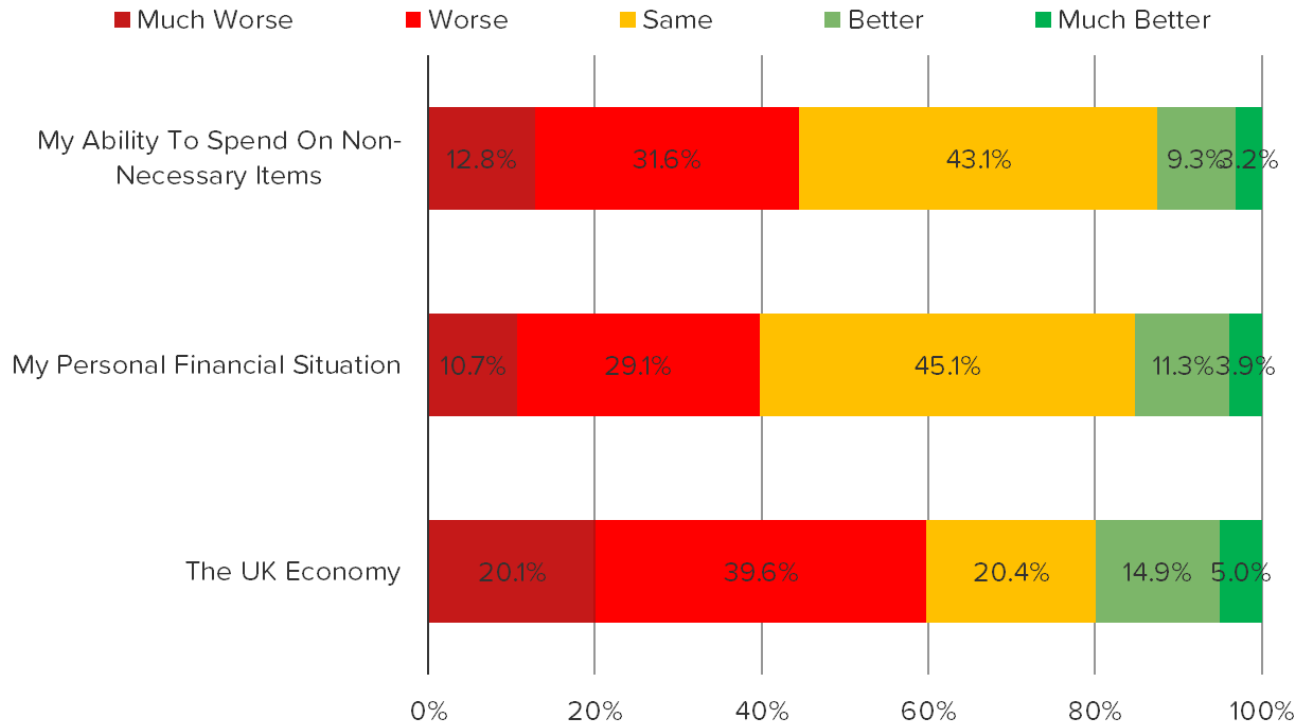


Do you expect the UK to leave the EU before the October 31st, 2019 deadline?

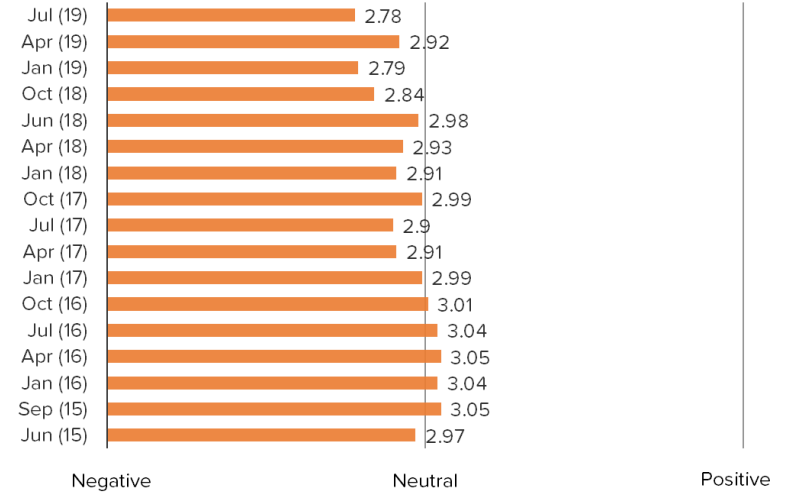
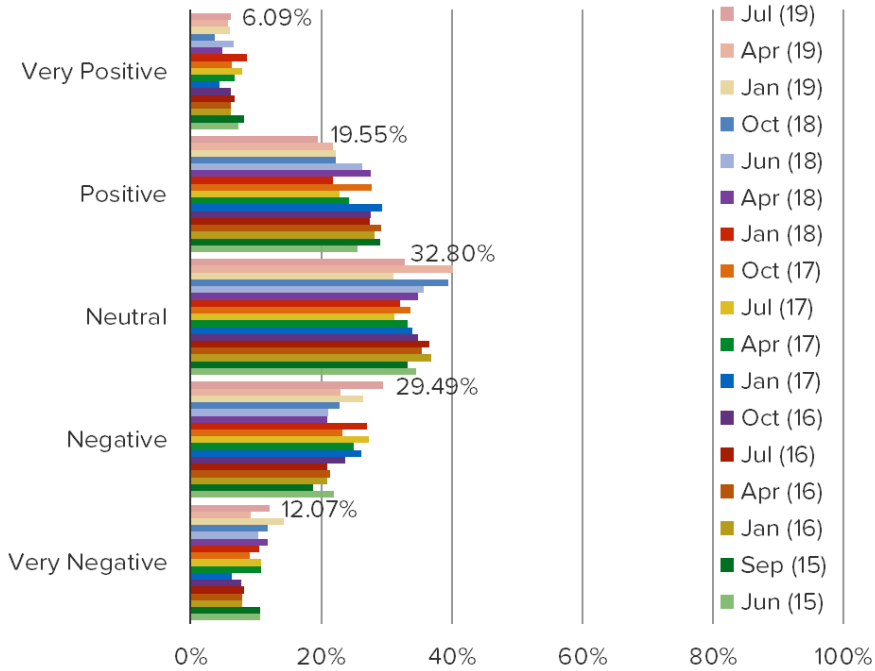

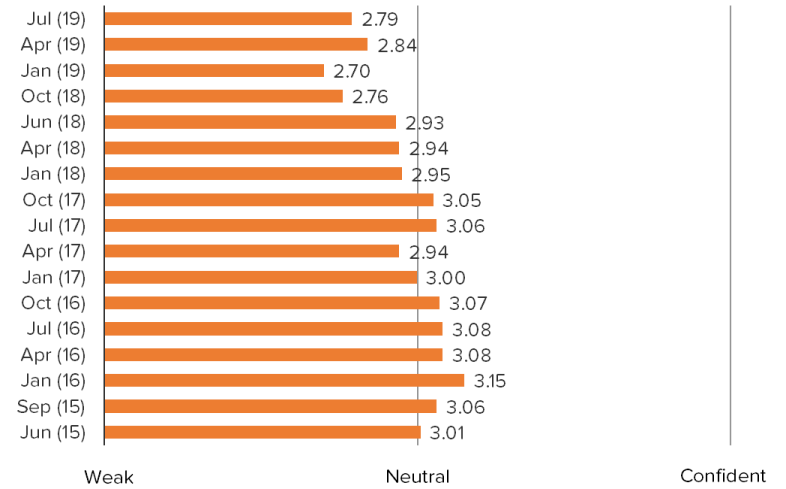
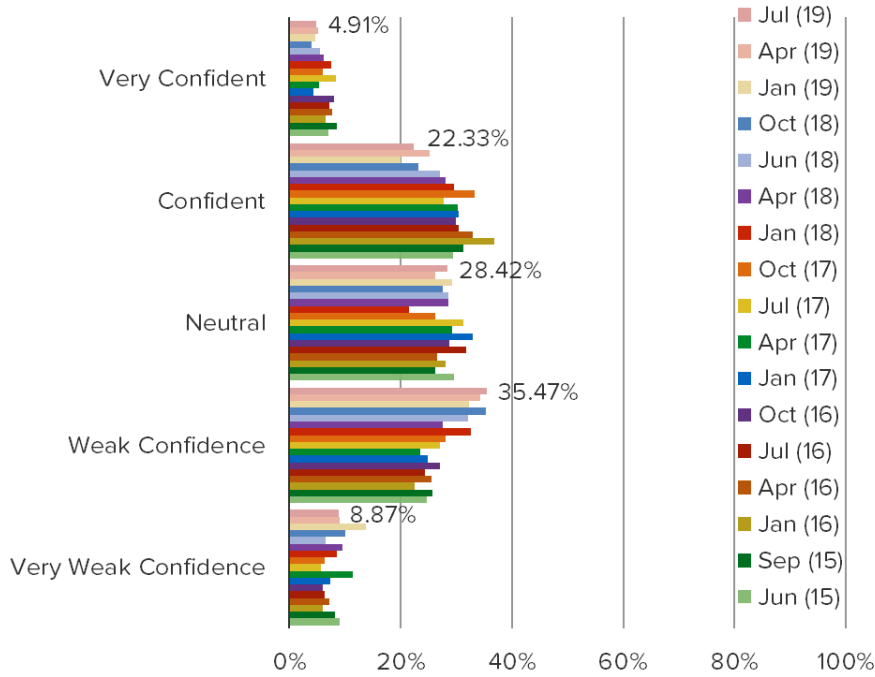


How do you currently feel about your personal finances?

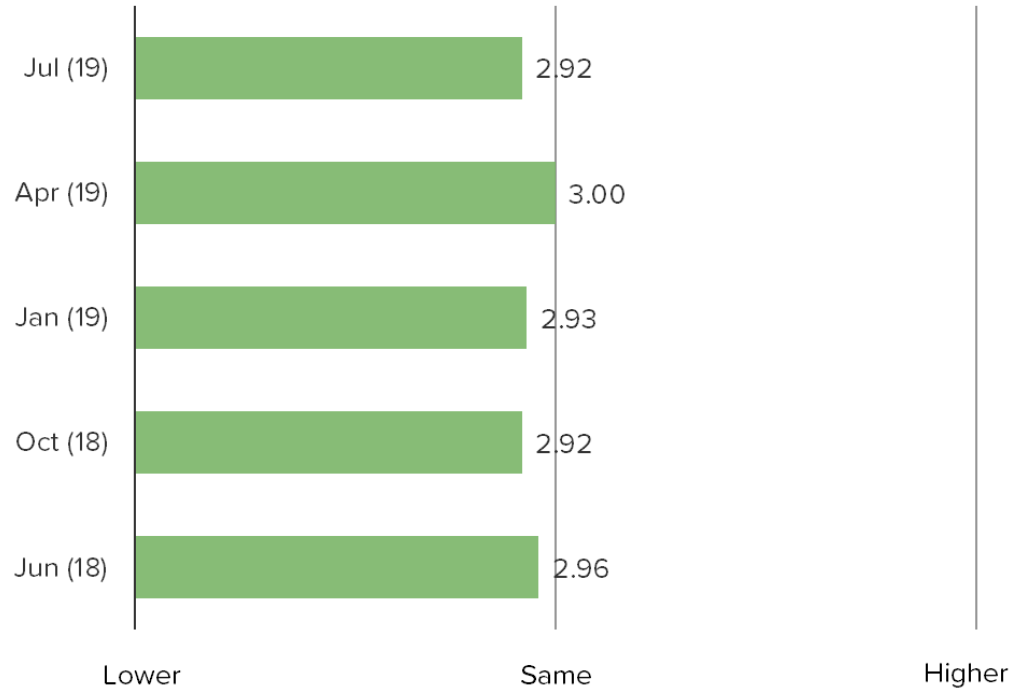
How confident do you currently feel about spending money?

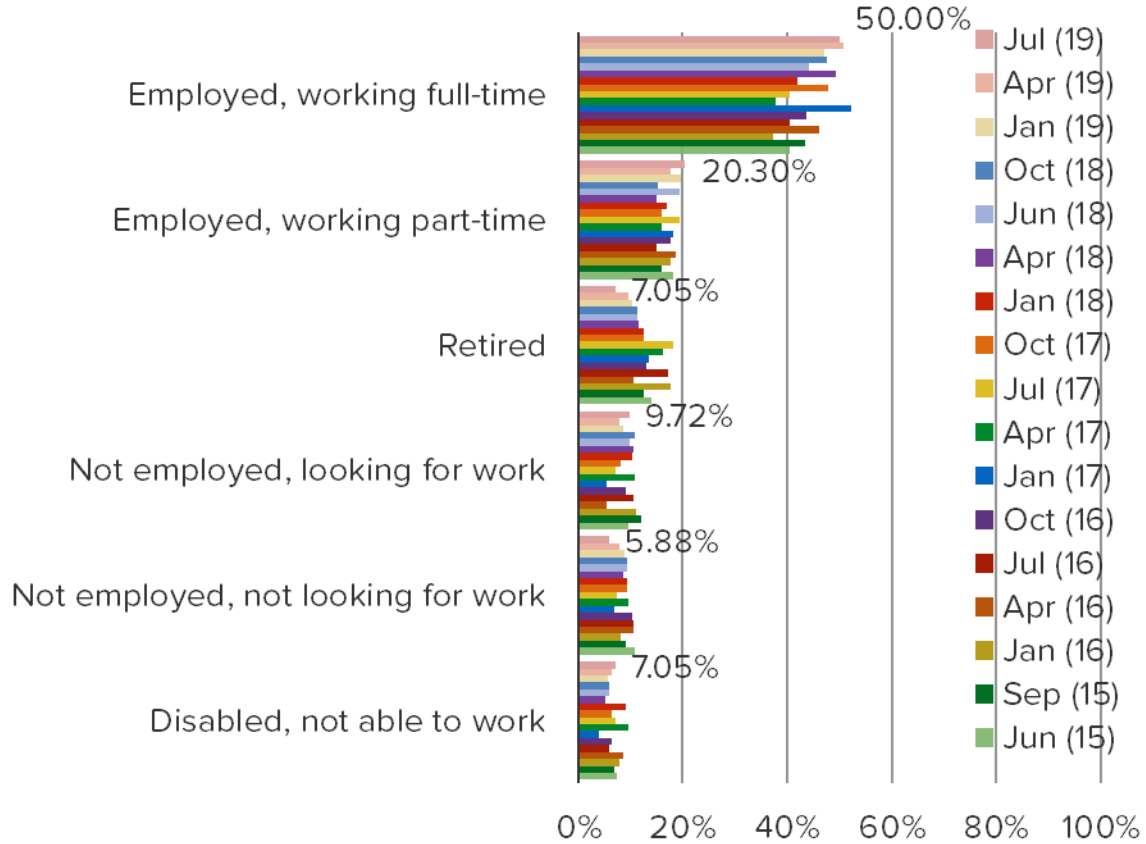
Is your household income higher or lower compared to a year ago?
